MNPHA is currently working with AMERESCO to bring an incredible tool to our members. The Capital Planning and Asset Management software can provide current data on prices and planning to extend the life of your building or buildings. It can be used for individual houses, townhouses, co-ops, apartments or entire portfolios. This software is state of the art although user friendly. It has components where you

add pictures of your property, boiler, windows whatever you wish to document, you can then add the year they were last replaced the most recent price you paid and the data is calculated on when they should next be considered for replacement and the potential capital you need for that time.

The data can show what needs to be done on a critical

Provincial housing plan will add 1,000 affordable units in three years



Housing and Community Development Minister Kerri Irvin-Ross announces the Manitoba government's plan on April 19, 2013 to build 1,000 new rental units.

CTV Winnipeg Published Friday, April 19, 2013 3:27PM CST

The provincial government's Budget 2013 includes a plan to build 1,000 new affordable rental housing units over the next three years.

Half of the new units will be social housing.

The new units are in addition to the 3,000 affordable and social units the province hopes to have added by 2014 through its HOMEworks! program.

The province will also introduce an eight per cent tax credit to encourage the private sector to build more apartments.

The NDP plans to spend \$100 million over the next three years to restore and redevelop Manitoba Housing units.

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New 45-Unit Apartment Building to be Developed in Winnipeg

A new 45-unit apartment building in Winnipeg will provide safe, affordable homes for families and for adults with mental health challenges. The building will be jointly funded by the Governments of Canada and Manitoba and will

The new project will be located at the corner of Molson Street and Kimberly Avenue in Winnipeg's East Kildonan area.

Manitoba's Housing and Community Development Minister Kerri Irvin-Ross, and Lawrence Toet, Member of Parliament for Elmwood-Transcona, on behalf of the Honourable Diane Finley, Minister of Human Resources and Skills Development Canada and Minister Responsible for Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC), made the funding announcement today.

"Safe and supportive housing is one of the most urgent needs of all Manitobans," said Irvin-Ross. "By providing affordable new housing for those who need it most we build a stronger, healthier community. This project is a good example of what can be accomplished when governments and communities work together."

"Through investments in affordable housing, the Government of Canada is providing assistance to those who need it most here in Manitoba and in all corners of the country," said MP Toet.

"These investments help create new jobs and stimulate the local economy, while providing access to safe, affordable homes for Canadian seniors, families and individuals."

Eden Health Care Services Inc. is a private non-profit corporation that offers mental health and housing programs as well as probe operated by Eden Health Care Services fessional counselling services in five rural communities and Winnipeg. Eden is owned and governed by the Mennonite Churches of Manitoba and provides core mental health services. The proposed design incorporates features that will make the building accessible to residents with mobility issues. The project will include 19 one-bedroom units, 14 two-bedroom units and 12 threebedroom units. Construction is expected to begin in the summer.

> "Eden Health Care Services recognizes the importance of safe, affordable housing as a key contributor to good mental health," said Glen Klassen, Board Chair, Eden Health Care Services. "Housing with appropriate supports allows for the most positive experience of community. The most effective housing projects are those where appropriate supports are built into the apartment community and experienced in an integrated and supportive

The Government of Canada and Manitoba will provide joint funding of \$11.9 million to help develop 45 units of affordable housing for families and adults in Winnipeg. The funding comes as a result of the \$62 million Investment in Affordable Housing 2011-2014 Agreement between the Governments of Canada and Manitoba. The Province of

Manitoba will use the funds under the new agreement to build more affordable housing and upgrade existing housing to ensure lowincome Manitobans will have safe, stable

The Government of Canada, through CMHC, will invest approximately \$2 billion in housing this year. Of this amount, \$1.7 billion will be spent in support of almost 605,000 households living in existing social housing. In Manitoba, this represents some 40,700 households. These investments are improving the quality of life for low-income Canadians and households living in existing social housing, including individuals who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness, seniors, persons with disabilities, recent immigrants and Aboriginal people.

HOMEWorks! is Manitoba's long-term housing strategy. Under this strategy, the province, through Manitoba Housing and Community Development continues to make significant investments in social and affordable housing. The province has committed to developing of 1,500 affordable housing units across the province and is well underway towards the construction of over 1,000 of these homes. HOMEWorks! supports ALL Aboard, Manitoba's poverty-reduction strategy, by increasing the supply of quality, affordable housing for low-income Manitobans.
