A Home for Everyone Federal Pre-Election Campaign Launched

The Canadian Housing and Renewal Association launched its pre-election campaign titled "A Home for Everyone" dedicated to making the next federal election all about community housing. The goal of this campaign is to inform and influence candidates from all political parties, and eventually the next government, on the need for continued support of community housing across Canada.

CHRA is Focusing on Three Key Asks

1. Develop and properly fund a distinct urban, rural and northern Indigenous Housing Strategy
2. Increase the supply of community housing
3. Protect the existing stock of community housing, and increase supports to address poverty

CHRA has launched an election website <https://www.ahomeforeveryone.ca/> that contains more information on these three issues and resources to help you communicate with the candidates in your riding.

Renewing Manitoba's Non-profit Sector

Add Your Voice to Manitoba's New Non-Profit Strategy Consultation

The Province of Manitoba is developing a new non-profit strategy. The stated intention behind the strategy is to build capacity and promote sustainability in the non-profit sector, in order to guide future spending. It will likely lead to changes in the sector for years to come.

- It's essential that the government hear from as many community-based organization volunteers, staff, participants, and funders as possible through their consultation. The in-person consultation in Winnipeg was held on May 9, however there are still opportunities in **Brandon on June 21 and Thompson on June 25**.

Jay Rodgers will be stepping down as the Deputy Minister of Families, to be replaced by John Leggat, who is the currently the CEO of St. Amant Centre, as of June 17.

Jay will taking on a different role within the province, leading the development of a Social Innovation Office.

MNPHA would like to thank Jay for his support of our association and members. He is truly a collaborative and strategic leader, and we look forward to the social innovations he will continue to develop.

We look forward to working with John Leggat. John began his career working with people with disabilities at the age of 19. He has held numerous positions related to children and families in the Manitoba government, including Acting Assistant Deputy Minister for Child & Family Services.

News and Updates



Announcement on the Reaching Home Strategy

The Government of Canada and End Homelessness Winnipeg held the Winnipeg launch of the Reaching Home strategy. End Homelessness Winnipeg will act as Interim Community Entity for Winnipeg, administering over \$9m in funding for homelessness reduction and prevention.

Lucille Bruce, CEO of End Homelessness Winnipeg, stated that "we need to be courageous and bold in addressing homelessness" to see people move into safe and appropriate housing.

The [Directives for Reaching Home](#) are now available, spelling out what will be eligible for funding. Like its predecessor, the Homelessness Partnering Strategy, Reaching Home is focused on reductions to chronic homelessness. However, it is more flexible, outcome-oriented, and more supportive of preventative interventions than in the past. While the development of social housing is not eligible for funding, transitional and supportive housing units, and

support services for those experiencing/at risk of homelessness are.

Brandon, Thompson, and Winnipeg will continue to receive Designated Community Funding under Reaching Home, in addition to Rural and Remote homelessness funding administered by the Brandon Neighbourhood Renewal Corporation.
