MNPHA is issuing a Call for Proposals for our 2022 Building Partnerships Conference! The call is open now, and we will accept responses until April 1, 2022. This year's conference is planned as an in-person event in Winnipeg, MB, however this may change depending on Public Health Orders at the time of the event.

The 2022 Building Partnerships Conference is planned to take place at Canadians Polo Park in Winnipeg, MB on September 26 and 27.

While we are open to a wide variety of session topics, some of the current issues we are hoping to address include:

- Housing and Reconciliation
- Isolation and Loneliness, especially concerning seniors
- Aging in Place
- Issues particular to rural and remote communities in Manitoba
- Mental health and harm reduction
- Climate change and net-zero building
- Homelessness 101
- Community Building with Tenants

This list is by no means exhaustive, and we encourage submissions on all topics addressing everything from building management to tenant wellness, or other themes that support building capacity within the non-profit housing sector. Across all topic areas, we value perspectives of people with lived experience, and sessions that will impart a specific set of skills or knowledge.

Conference attendees always request more speakers from amongst their peers in the non-profit housing sector. Therefore, presenters from non-profit housing organizations speaking about their own experience, project, or area of expertise are highly encouraged to propose a topic for an individual session or a panel discussion. Speakers receive one day of complimentary conference attendance.
