

ACTION FOR HOUSING: LESSONS FROM NOVA SCOTIA IN GROWING AND SUSTAINING COMMUNITY HOUSING

Nova Scotia is experiencing unprecedented housing challenges, with strong population growth, demand for employment, and the price of housing escalating rapidly. In this context, the Province launched an Affordable Housing Commission, co-chaired by Dr. Ren Thomas. The Commission engaged over 2,000 Nova Scotians, and developed recommendations to the government and partners that will change the affordable housing sector with a major focus on non-profit housing

The presentation will cover the recommendations from the Commission, a review of what the Government of Nova Scotia has done to date, and an interactive discussion on what Manitoba can and should do to empower and grow our non-profit housing sector.




